

The Simpsons – Glossary

animated adjective

an animated film or cartoon consists of a series of drawings that are shown quickly one after another so that they look as if they are moving

Buddhist adjective

a person who follows the set of religious beliefs based on the teaching of Siddhartha Gautama.

catchphrase noun [count]

a short phrase that many people know because a famous person often says it

character noun [count]

a person in a book, play, film etc The film's central character is played by George Clooney.

controversy noun [count/uncount]

a disagreement, especially about a public policy or a moral issue that a lot of people have strong feelings about

The election ended in controversy, with allegations of widespread vote-rigging.

devoted adjective

loving someone very much

They were devoted to each other throughout their marriage.

dysfunctional adjective

dysfunctional relationships do not work normally and are not happy or successful *a dysfunctional family*

episode noun [count]

a part of a television or radio story that is broadcast separately and forms one of a series

inconsiderate adjective

not thinking about other people and their feelings

joke noun [count]

something you say or do that is intended to make people laugh

Greg sprayed her with water as a joke.

likeable adjective

pleasant, friendly, and easy to like *a likeable character*

lovable adjective

attractive and easy to like

How could anyone abandon such a lovable little kitten?

maintain verb

to make sure that something stays at the same level, rate, or standard

Regular inspections ensure that high safety standards are maintained.

mischievous adjective

a mischievous person, especially a child, enjoys having fun by causing trouble

There were always mischievous boys around.

nuclear adjective

relating to energy produced by changing the structure of the central part of an atom *nuclear power/energy*

poke fun at phrase

to make jokes about someone or something in an unkind way

The other children poked fun at her because she was always so serious.

release verb

to make a film, video, or CD available for people to see or buy

They have just released their second album.

series noun [count]

a set of television or radio programmes that are all about a particular subject, person, or group of people

sitcom noun [count]

a television or radio series about a particular group of characters who deal with situations in a humorous way

suck verb

to put something in your mouth and move your tongue against it

She sucked on a sweet and stared at us.

universal adjective

involving or affecting everyone in the world the universal language of music

untrained adjective

an animal that is untrained does not obey people

vegetarian noun [count]

someone who chooses not to eat meat or fish

visual adjective

relating to things that you can see

Television news brings us visual images from around the world the visual arts
